HERE ARE A FEW 6TH CHORDS YOU MIGHT NEED TOO. THE FORMULA HERE DEPARTS FROM THE USUAL "CHORDS BUILT IN 3RD'S FORMULA. THESE ARE TRIADS WITH A 6TH ADDED INSTEAD OF A 7TH DEGREE.

THERE IS EITHER A MAJOR TRIAD WITH A 6TH - JUST CALLED A 6TH CHORD OR A MINOR TRIAD WITH A 6TH - CALLED A MINOR 6TH CHORD
